The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Bangerter.

Council Member Budge led the Pledge of Allegiance and gave the invocation.

Approval of Minutes: Council Member Budge made a motion to approve the minutes of October 4, 2011 as presented. Council Member Andrews seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Approval of Vouchers: Council Member Budge made a motion to approve the voucher for John & Lu Jean Jenkins in the amount of \$12,019.00. Council Member Carlson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Citizen Comments: Terry Avondet stated she attended the Sunset Jr. High School Fun Run and thanked the Police and Fire Departments for all the work they did there. They provided a lot of support and morale boosting and the kids loved it. She advised the quilt project is going well and she has had to empty the quilt donation box once already because it was full. November is shaken baby and infant abuse month and the hospitals use purple baby caps as a sign of prevention so they can be donated to her as well.

1. **Appoint poll workers for the 2011 Municipal Election:** Recorder Hale commented that Davis County was providing most of the election services this year, which included choosing the poll workers. She read the names of the poll workers as follows: Barbara Gorringer and Joyce Hammer as Poll Book Clerks, Richard Jackson as Poll Manager, Sharlyn Ellison as Provisional Clerk, Pamela Stanger and Donna Berkley as Receiving Clerks and Susan Hale as the Touch Screen Technician.

Council Member Carlson made a motion to appoint the poll workers as announced. Council Member Budge seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

2. **Council Member Reports and General Information:** Council Member Budge told Terry Avondet how much she appreciated what she does. She appreciates everyone who worked on holding the debate and thought it went very well.

Council Member Andrews thanked all the candidates for running for Council because he knows how much work it is emotionally and financially and explained some of their campaign promises may have to be broken. He thanked all the employees of the City, the Mayor and Council Members for all they do.

Council Member Carlson thanked the Public Works employees for their fast response to a resident's sewer problem and said he has received some positive comments about the Police Department.

Police Chief Eborn reminded everyone that tomorrow is Doxey Elementary School's "Lunch with the Mayor" and invited the Council Members to attend if they would like to. He again reminded everyone about the Prescription Take Back event at Smith's Food & Drug on October 29th between 10:00 am and 2:00 pm. The Fun Run went well and thanked Mrs. Avondet for her comments, but said they left out Public Works who put out and took down the barricades and painted arrows on the roads, so he thanked them for that.

Treasurer/Office Manager Youngdell said she received a phone call from the Davis County School District. It was an invitation for Chief Eborn, Mayor Bangerter and the Council Members to attend a luncheon in Farmington with the Superintendent, Asst. Superintendent and the Principals of the local schools so they can get to know each other. It will be held November 16th at noon. They will also be receiving a formal invitation.

Public Works Director Hennessee said Horrocks Engineering will be holding a think tank meeting in the Sunset Room for three days in the first week of November. There will be people from everywhere to try and get some ideas and innovations on how to do the I-15 interchange. Then they will have a follow up meeting around November 9th. Once that happens he will email the Mayor and Council to let them know what they have come up with. Mayor Bangerter asked him if he thought it was time to set up a couple work meetings to talk about financing the public works and fire buildings. Director Hennessee replied he is working on the cost estimates now then they can discuss it.

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Fire Chief Coker said the Fire Department is gearing up for the holidays. He advised the Sunset Elementary School remodel and addition will begin soon.

Mayor Bangerter commented a group of residents will be cleaning up the community garden this Saturday. There were a lot of letters sent out this month to residents who needed to prune their tree limbs and the shop area drop off has been closed as of October 15th so they will have to take their limbs to the land fill. Chief Eborn will do follow up checks to ensure compliance. He asked Chief Eborn how the new Officer was working out. Chief Eborn replied he is still doing the field training program and is in the six month probation period. He seems to be doing well so far. He is now driving a police car to and from work, but he is not driving it during work hours yet. Mayor Bangerter said the debate was attended by around 50 people. The last topic was the residents' top concerns, which were the budget, the 1800 North project, kids, ordinances and crime. He encouraged the Council to review the City's general plan, make notes of items that need changing and give those notes to the Planning Commission so they will know which direction the Council would like them to go with it.

Council Member Andrews made a motion to adjourn. Council Member Budge seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
