The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Bangerter.

Council Member Andrews gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Approval of Minutes:** Council Member Andrews made a motion to approve the minutes of November 6, 2013 as presented. Council Member Peterson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**Approval of Vouchers:** Council Member Carlson made a motion to approve the vouchers for Christensen, Palmer & Ambrose, Fox Wood Construction, Spillman Technologies and Intoximeters totaling \$39,321.30. Council Member Furniss seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**Public Comments:** There were none.

1. **Canvass 2013 Election:** Recorder Hale passed the poll books out to the Mayor and Council Members. They checked to make sure the number of votes in the poll books matched the canvass report. The total from the poll books was one higher than the votes counted in the

report and that was because one ballot was rejected due to the voter not being registered. Results: Mayor) Beverly K. Macfarlane – 488, Ryan Furniss – 172; Council) Chris R. Hadley – 378, Trystal Peay – 376, Ricky Carlson – 334, Brent Andrews – 149.

Council Member Furniss made a motion to accept the 2013 Municipal Election Canvass as presented. Council Member Peterson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Council Members Andrews, Furniss, Peterson, Snow and Carlson voting yes.

- 2. Discussion and possible approval of selling public works truck:** Public Works Director Noyes explained the two vehicles the Council approved have been sold; the 1-ton for \$6,500 and the Ranger for \$2,200. He would now like to sell the Mazda so all the vehicles they don't need will be gone. Like the first two, he will try to sell it through the sealed bid process and if he does not get a good enough bid, he will sell it through advertising.

Council Member Furniss made a motion to allow Public Works Director Noyes to sell the Mazda. Mayor Bangerter explained the money for the sales of the vehicles will go into the general fund, the funds will be used towards the purchase of a new police vehicle and the police truck will go to Public Works. Council Member Carlson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Council Members Andrews, Furniss, Peterson, Snow and Carlson voting yes.

- 3. Council Member reports and general information:** Council Member Andrews thanked the Scouts for attending the meeting. He also thanked the employees of the City for all they do. He thanked the citizens for his time as a Council Member and said he hopes there will be a smooth transition for the newly Elected Officials.

Council Member Carlson also thanked the Scouts for attending.

Council Member Peterson echoed the above in thanking the Scouts for attending. He thanked the employees and citizens.

Council Member Furniss thanked the Scouts for being present. He congratulated Beverly Macfarlane, Trystal Peay and Chris Hadley on their Elections. About half way through he considered withdrawing because he could see the writing on the wall and believes Mrs. Macfarlane will be a fine Mayor. Mayor Bangerter is a good Mayor and works hard for the City. Back when the Division of Water Quality issued the permit for the North Davis Sewer District to discharge water into the Great Salt Lake, they set standards. The plant was built to comply with those standards. Now the EPA is saying those levels are too high. To comply with those standards would cost millions and millions of dollars, so the District is using its own scientists and engineers to prove to the State that the EPA is wrong. Another thing is there is quite a distance between the plant and the Great Salt Lake. Discharging that fresh water has created a semi wet land. The EPA wants to regulate that section of earth that the North Davis Sewer District has created. If the EPA wins it will cause major impacts, such as an additional \$10.00 per resident per month. The Central Weber Sewer District discharges

into a river so their standards are already higher. The Districts in Utah have formed a coalition to hire their own experts.

Treasurer/Office Manager Youngdell advised Thursday's Planning Commission meeting has been cancelled because each Member is working on a section of a project and there are no requests to go before them. She has received the new rates from the City's insurance company. The workers comp and vehicle premiums are not changing and general liability will have a minimal increase. The Department Heads are working on getting the safety grant again this year and there are a lot more regulations and reporting required now, making it more labor intensive.

Public Works Director Noyes invited the newly Elected Officials to meet with him to ask any questions or discuss any concerns they have after first calling to make sure he'll be in his office.

Police Chief Eborn congratulated the newly Elected Officials. He advised he has collected the campaign signs that were missed being picked up and he will be returning them to the candidates.

Fire Chief Lowman said the Fire Department gets alerts and they received a weather alert for tonight of wind gusts reaching 50-60 mph. He welcomed the Scouts and advised the Fire Department has a 'Learning for Life' program where kids age 14 and above can learn about the fire service. Sunset Citizen Corps has been selected to be the Davis County Chair for 2014 and Allyson Jackson has volunteered to take over the leadership for Citizen Corps. The Department has just finished their EMT advanced class. It gives some of the fire fighters the chance to advance in knowledge, ability and certification. He welcomed the newly Elected Officials and thanked the outgoing Officials for their service. He advised today is the 150 year anniversary of the Gettysburg Address.

Recorder Hale announced Mayor Bangerter has 48 days left of his term.

Mayor Bangerter welcomed the Scouts, congratulated the newly Elected Officials and thanked the staff for their hard work. It amazes him how upset some of the residents become over some of the decisions they make as a Council. He always points out to them when they move into a community they should accept the fact they live in a community, with community meaning they work together for the betterment of the community. Some were upset with the recycling program, but if they don't work on recycling the landfill will fill up and it will cost even more to transport garbage out of Davis County. The Council gave Mayor Bangerter the duty to allow people who missed the opt-out date to opt out. He believes enough time has gone by that he shouldn't have to allow anyone to opt out now. They have had the can(s) for five months now and should have called earlier. When the program rolled out, it was said those who didn't opt out would need to keep the can(s) for one year, then they could opt out if they so chose. He would like those who call now to be told they can present the reason they need to opt out to the Council or keep the can until June. The Council agreed it has been long enough they shouldn't be able to opt out until June.




