**The Neighborhood Dumpster Program** is being offered free of charge to Sunset residents again this summer. The program is available March 15<sup>th</sup> – October 15<sup>th</sup>. Residents may request a 30 cubic yard roll-off dumpster once per season per household (plus 5 neighbors) for their neighborhood cleanup project. The dumpster will be delivered on a Thursday and picked up on the following Monday. Residents may sign up for the dumpster at the City Office, 200 W. 1300 N.



**Paper Recycling Bins** are located in the east parking lot of the City Building (200 W 1300 N) and in the east, upper parking lot of the Fire Station (85 W 1800 N). Newspaper, magazines, junk mail, phonebooks, paperback and hardbound books, paper bags, craft paper, cereal boxes, small amounts of flattened cardboard boxes, office paper and poster paper may be deposited in the bins.

You won't believe how much more room you'll have in your garbage cans when you start recycling your paper items!

**This Spring** we would like to remind residents to keep their trees and bushes trimmed back so as not to obscure traffic signs and sidewalks. Limbs need to be 9 feet above sidewalks and bushes trimmed back one foot from the sidewalks. Tree limbs should be 15 feet above the road and not interfere with vehicles or block road signs.

### Indoor Water Conservation Tips

- ❖ Toilets consume about 27 percent of the water used inside the home. You can save water and money by checking your toilets for leaks, replacing your flapper and installing a fill cycle diverter or upgrading to a high-efficiency toilet.
- ❖ Installing an early-closure flapper can save from one half to 1.5 gallons per flush. Investing in a high-efficiency toilet can save more than 4,000 gallons of water per person each year.
- ❖ A full bathtub requires 70 gallons of water, while taking a five-minute shower under a low-flow showerhead uses 10 -25 gallons.



### Outdoor Water Conservation Tips

Sunset City is asking residents to keep up their effort in conserving water. Summer is almost here and we would like to offer a few tips on lawn watering and tree planting. Typically, households use 50% of their water for lawn and gardens.

- ✓ Water between 6:00 P.M. and 10:00 A.M. Avoid watering during the heat of the day when the sun's rays are strongest in evaporating water.
- ✓ Avoid watering on windy days and don't water during the rain.
- ✓ Keep your grass 3 inches long or more. This shades the soil and prevents both excessive drying and evaporation. Add a 2 to 3 inch layer of mulch around flowers, shrubs and trees to help retain the moisture.
- ✓ Watering everyday creates shallow roots. Watering infrequently develops deep roots and healthier turf. Grass roots grow deeper into the soil and become stronger with less watering. If grass does not spring back after being stepped on, it's time to water. Water only when needed, less when it's cool and more when it's hot.

## Sunset City Citizen Corps Council

Did you know that, according to the Utah Dept. of Homeland Security's *Be Ready Utah* website, there are over 700 earthquakes in Utah every year? Though most are very small, we are aware that there can be what they call 'fore-quakes' that can occur for up to years leading to a major earthquake.



We encourage all residents to prepare themselves for the possibility of a major emergency. To help you know where to begin, we will be hosting a community class with "The Earthquake Lady" from the Utah Department of Homeland Security. It is scheduled for Wednesday April 14, 2010 - watch for more information as it gets closer. Come and learn what steps you can start taking now to prepare your family!

We continue to make strides to prepare our City for a major disaster/emergency. One of the biggest ways we do this is to offer C.E.R.T. (**Community Emergency Response Team**) training. This training teaches small fire suppression, light search and rescue, first aid, and other skills to respond in the event of a major emergency in our community. ## From the Police Department



### Facts about Prescription Drug Disposal

- Unused medications improperly disposed of can harm you and your environment.
- Medications can be scavenged and illegally sold.
- Children and animals could be poisoned if they find and swallow drugs.
- When medications are flushed, they are not removed by the sewage treatment facilities and septic tank systems and can enter the soil, surface water and ground water.
- Studies have shown that exposure to drugs found in waterways is having a serious negative impact on fish and other aquatic life.
- Pollution prevention (the elimination or minimization of the pollution source) is preferable to cleaning up the environment.

Any unwanted prescription medications can be dropped off at the Sunset Police Department between the hours of 9:00 a.m. – 12 noon and 1:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. No questions will be asked and medications will be disposed of properly and safely. If you would like to call before you come in, you can contact us at 801-825-1620. In the near future Sunset City hopes to have a confidential drop-off container in the City Building.

## A Message from the Fire Department

### Scald Burn Injuries



Scald burns are the most common burn injury among children age 4 and younger, and kids in this age group have the highest mortality rates for this type of injury. In one year, U.S. hospitals treated an estimated 16,000 children under the age of 5 for scalds. Every day, 300 young children with burn injuries are taken to emergency rooms. They weren't even near a flame. The children are victims of scalds. Clearly, this is a real danger. Scald burns (caused by hot liquids, steam or foods) are the most common burn injury among children age 4 and younger. In 2003, U.S. hospitals treated an estimated 16,000 children under 5 for scalds, according to the Consumer Product Safety Commission. And mortality rates from scalds are highest for children under age 4.

Ninety-five percent of scalds occur in residences. Scald burns are typically related to ordinary activities – bathing, cooking and eating – and often happen to children because of a lapse in adult supervision or a lack of protective measures. Youngsters may not understand or even be aware of potential dangers of hot liquids (especially water) and foods; they simply trust adults to keep them safe. In addition, young children have thinner skin that burns more quickly than adults'. People of all ages can be burned in 30 seconds by a flowing liquid that is 130 degrees; at 140 degrees, it takes only five seconds; at 160 degrees, it only takes one second. For children under 5, these temperatures can cause a burn in half the time.

### Preventing Scalds

- Lower the temperature settings on water heaters to 120 degrees or less.
- Install anti-scald devices on water faucets and shower heads.
- When filling the bathtub, turn on cold water first. Mix in warmer water carefully.
- Check the water temperature by moving your hand through the water. If the water feels hot to an adult, it is too hot for a child.
- Use knob covers on faucets.
- Use oven mitts or hot pads when cooking.
- Turn pot handles in-ward.
- Thoroughly stir all micro-waved food.
- Never heat baby bottles in a microwave.
- Do not use deep fryers around children.


