I received a report from the Davis County Tobacco Compliance Program and out of 20 attempts to purchase tobacco by underage people in the program, Sunset City businesses had ZERO buys! In fact, the four businesses were awarded certificates of recognition for not selling tobacco products to underage buyers from July 2010 to June 2011. Saigon Market was recognized in the 20 or more years category, Smith's Food & Drug was recognized in the 5 or more years category and 7-Eleven and TESORO was recognized in the one or more years category.

I would like to encourage all of our residents to shop in Sunset first. It not only helps our businesses to flourish, it also helps to keep your property taxes down. Commemorating a conflagration

Fire Prevention Week was established to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire, the tragic 1871 conflagration that killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures and burned more than 2,000 acres. The fire began on October 8, but continued into and did most of its damage on October 9, 1871.

According to popular legend, the fire broke out after a cow - belonging to Mrs. Catherine O'Leary - kicked over a lamp, setting first the barn, then the whole city on fire. Chances are you've heard some version of this story yourself; people have been blaming the Great Chicago Fire on the cow and Mrs. O'Leary for more than 130 years, although recent research by Chicago historian Robert Cromie has helped to debunk this version of events.

A Few Words from the Police Department

Hill AFB Air Sampling

Air Tests Offered To Sunset Residents

Hill AFB plans to test the air in Sunset homes this fall and winter as part of its continuing indoor air sampling program. In September, information packets were mailed to approximately 580 residents who live above the area of groundwater contamination in Sunset. These packets included more detailed information about the indoor air sampling program and a postcard that residents can return if they wish to have their homes tested.

While not in the drinking water, chemicals found in the groundwater can evaporate and enter into homes. Over the past few years, Hill has tested the air in more than 1,800 homes, including 319 in Sunset. Approximately 11 percent of the homes tested in Sunset have been found to have very low levels of chemical vapors. At the levels typically found, the vapors do not pose a health risk to residents, but to ensure residents' safety, the Air Force will work with residents to monitor and, if levels are above health based standards, install a system in the home to keep vapors from entering. There is no cost to the resident for any of the actions taken as part of the air sampling program.

The project team is currently finalizing the refined alternatives screening. We will be publishing the refinements on our project website in early September. These refined alternatives will be carried forward into the Draft EIS for further study.

The refined alternatives will reflect data from the public comments we have received as well as further study analysis. There will be slight shifts in some areas and more substantial adjustments in others.
