Winter Regulations

With winter just around the corner, please note parking is not allowed on the street from the hours of 10:00 pm to 6:00 am from November 15 to March 15. As you know Mother Nature does not

always cooperate with that time frame, so the Public Works Department would greatly appreciate it if you could avoid parking on the street during the day and bring in your garbage cans as soon as possible when it is snowing or a snow storm is expected. That way they can plow the streets a little more quickly so you can get to where you're going safely.

City Code states it is unlawful for any person removing snow from a sidewalk or driveway to deposit said snow in the street. When the snow is blown or shoveled out into the street, it has to go somewhere and usually ends up back on your driveway or sidewalk when the snow plow comes back through.

Please help our Fire Fighters by shoveling the snow away from the fire hydrant if one is located in your yard. Seconds count when your house is on fire.
